EMS for Children Day highlights the unique emergency care needs of children and emphasizes the importance of properly trained emergency personnel, appropriately equipped ambulances and emergency departments, and well-defined pediatric treatment procedures.

EMS systems dramatically improve the survival and recovery rate of people who experience sudden illness or injury, and EMS personnel are dedicated to saving lives through injury prevention, safety awareness, and emergency preparedness.

WHEREAS, EMSC espouses the tenets and practices of family-centered and culturally competent care for children and their families; and

WHEREAS, EMSC works with physicians, nurses, social workers, psychologists, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, firefighters, educators, administrators and others to identify and address the issues surrounding the provision of optimal pediatric care; and

WHEREAS, EMSC develops training programs and guidelines for emergency care providers so that children with special health care needs get timely, appropriate care; and

WHEREAS, Emergency Medical Services for Children Day is a time to recognize the value and accomplishments of the men and women who have dedicated their lives to saving our children.

NOW, THEREFORE, as Governor of the State of North Dakota, I do hereby proclaim May 18, 2016, **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES FOR CHILDREN DAY** in the state of North Dakota.
