Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Awards Six Project Loans

Bismarck, N.D. – The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program awarded loans to six North Dakota cities and rural water districts to help them maintain and improve their water supplies.

- Casselton - \$1,210,000 toward a \$2,458,000 project to construct a 500,000-gallon water tower and remove the existing storage structures.
- Glenburn - \$939,000 toward a \$2,176,500 project to construct a 150,000-gallon water tower and improvements to the distribution system.
- Kindred - \$600,000 toward a \$1,355,000 project to construct a 100,000-gallon water tower and remove the existing storage structure.
- North Prairie Rural Water District - \$175,000 for a project to rehabilitate a water tower.
- R & T Water Supply Commerce Authority - \$5,000,000 to allow Western Area Water Supply Authority (WAWSA) to add 28 miles of distribution lines, 11 miles of transmission main, two pump stations, and a 1-million gallon water storage reservoir.
- Williams Rural Water District - \$5,000,000 to allow WAWSA to add 66 miles of rural distribution lines and 10 miles of transmission main.

The DWSRF Program is administered by the North Dakota Department of Health with funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The program offers below-market interest rate loans to political subdivisions for financing projects authorized under the Safe Drinking Water Act. DWSRF programs operate nationwide to provide the funding necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure that protects and supplies valuable water resources.
